Today is the first day that I have used My Community so I thought I would give this blog a try. I'm thinking I may use it to keep a diary of my progress within the course.






Keeping track of a Tutor or Friends' Blog

You can see other blogs by clicking **friends blogs** which appears under your name.

You will notice at the top left of their blog page beneath your name is an icon as seen here >>



This is an RSS feed icon, you may have read or heard about these elsewhere. It is basically the name of a technology which allows you receive updates whenever a change is made to something, in this case a blog. You can read more about RSS [here](#).

How

In your friend's blogpage, copy the URL (the address will start with <http://www.uspace.org.uk/community>.... and is at the very top of your screen). Click on MyFeeds (above the UsPaCe logo). At the bottom of the page paste the URL into the box and click subscribe. You can set up as many RSS feeds as you like providing you see the RSS icon and you will only have to go to one place to see what all your friends are doing. You can also set up RSS feeds from external sites like the BBC.

So why would you want to use this. Well, you can put RSS feeds into your “**My Noticeboard**” homepage, so if you want to keep track of a friend or tutors blog you can simply click on the RSS icon on their page, a new page will then load from which you can copy the web address out of.

NOTE: It is important that you note that only blog posts made public can be accessed by an RSS feed, so any private or for logged in users will not be accessible outside of the UsPaCe site!
